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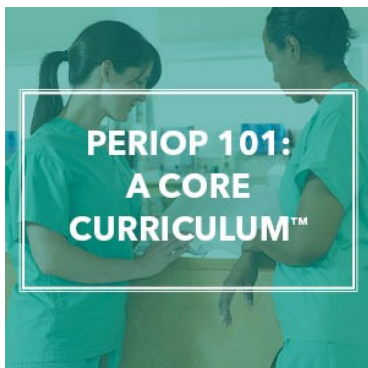

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Perioperative Nurse Residency

Perioperative nursing is a nursing specialty practice area focused on providing safe quality nursing care for the patient undergoing operative or other invasive procedures. The perioperative nurse uses the nursing process to develop individualized plans of care and to coordinate and deliver care to their patients.

This intensive 24 week nurse residency program covers all aspects of nursing care in the areas of perioperative nursing. Residents will learn in a blended educational environment consisting of a standardized, evidence-based curriculum and textbook readings with hands-on skills lab and clinical practicum led by experienced perioperative nurses.
